2022 Property Taxes

Saskatchewan Beach 2022 property taxes must be in the Municipal Office by December 31, 2022 to avoid a 15% interest charge added to the tax card on January 1, 2023. Payment can be made by e-transfer to saskbeach@sasktel.net, cheque, or through your bank (Affinity Credit Union, Central 1 Credit Union, BMO, RBC, Scotiabank, CIBC).

Cheques can also be dropped off at the Municipal Office through the front door mail slot.

Snow Removal in the Village

After a snowfall, our maintenance team will clear the main arteries first, secondary roads next, and then lanes.

Maintenance will do their best with equipment used and time restraints to avoid making ridges. However, it is the responsibility of the property owner to clear the ridge along their driveway.

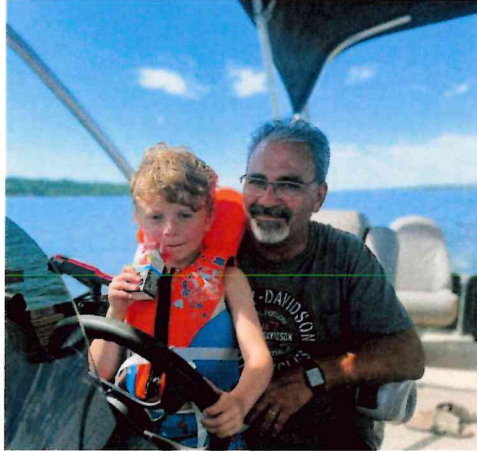
Meet Your Council
