### Fire Ban

The fire ban which was implemented on July 2, 2021 is still in effect. The fire hazard is currently rated as extreme.

### CiB Plant Pot Judging – August 1 to 13

It's time to vote for your favourite Communities in Bloom (CiB) plant pot!

Use the ballot on the following page for the addresses of the pots and to vote for your 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> placings. Each household can vote once.

Evaluation criteria may include the design and arrangements of flowers and plants (annuals, perennials, bulbs, ornamental grasses, edible plants, water efficient and pollinator friendly plants) in the context of originality, distribution, location, diversity and balance, colour, and harmony. Container decoration and overall feeling may also be considered.

Drop off your ballot at the Village office or email it in by August 13.

The top 3 pots will be awarded ribbons, a gift certificate from D's Place, and a hoodie from the Siltou General Store. The RV of Sask Beach Mayor and Council extend their compliments to ALL CiB gardeners who through drought, persistent wind, and plough winds produced picturesque plant pot displays.

### Etiquette for Blue Bins

Remember, the blue bin is for recycling. Items accepted include: paper, shredded paper in clear bags, plastic milk just, milk and juice cartons, tin, aluminum, and glass. Items not accepted include clam shell #1 containers, light bulbs, plastic bags and stretch wrap, wood and metal scrap, diapers, Styrofoam, hoses, rubber items, toys, clothing, food and garbage. The blue bin is located on the corner of Hillcrest & Grove.



Two new signs have been installed to help direct traffic to the boat launch and to decrease traffic through residential areas. Speed

bumps are also in place to slow down traffic and reduce dust.
