Dutch Elm Disease (DED)

As of September 1st elm trees in Saskatchewan can be pruned. It is illegal to prune elm trees between April 1 and August 31 which is when the tiny elm bark beetles that carry DED are most active. Fresh cuts from pruning can attract the insects, potentially spreading the disease from infected trees to healthy ones.

In Saskatchewan, it is illegal to transport, store or use elm firewood. Dispose of elm wood promptly, by burning or taking it to the Last Mountain Regional Landfill to be buried.

Septic Tank Lid Safety

Safety is a primary consideration when installing and working around septic tanks. Access and lids should meet the following standards:

- All tanks must have at least one access opening with a minimum access opening of 24 inches.
- All access openings must have a secure, airtight child resistant lid or cover that is a minimum weight of 65 lbs. and that can only be removed with tools.
- The manway/riser and lid should extend above the finished grade with surrounding landscape sloped to ensure any surface water will drain away from the tank.
- Access openings must prevent infiltration and exfiltration of wastewater and groundwater.
- It is highly recommended that safety screens (kid catchers) be installed in all access openings.
