Please cut your grass!

Bylaw 171 the Nuisance Abatement
Bylaw requires property owners to cut the grass, vegetation and weeds on their property. The Bylaw Enforcement officer will send a warning first. If the warning details are not met an Order to Remedy will be sent. If the items outlined in the Order to Remedy are not completed, the Village will complete the items and the property owner will be responsible for the costs.

This applies to undeveloped (empty) lots too.

Outdoor Storage of Materials

Bylaw 171, Section 15:

Any building materials, lumber, scrap metal, boxes or similar items stored in a yard shall be neatly stacked in piles and elevated off the ground so as not to constitute a nuisance or harborage for rodents, vermin and insects.

Bylaw 171, Section 16:

Materials referred to in Section 15 shall be at least 0.15 metres (5 inches) off the ground and shall be stacked at least 3.0 metres (10 feet) from exterior walls of any building and at least 1.0 metres (3 feet) from the property line.
